EndNote is a bibliographic management software program that allows you to maintain a database of your references and citations and further reformat them according to different bibliographic styles. EndNote can also import, reformat, and store reference information retrieved from remote bibliographic databases, files, and catalogues. Additionally, EndNote allows you to create bibliographies instantly and automatically from the references stored in your personal EndNote library database. Product info is available at:

Using Endnote at UC

The University has a site-license for EndNote. This means that if you are member of the academic or general staff, or you are currently enrolled student you can use EndNote either on campus or at your principal residence. Use of the software is limited to use related to course work, research work, or other work directly related to the users relationship with the University.

All computers (both PCs and Macs) in the student workrooms currently have Endnote installed already, and access to the relevant styles, filters and connection files. Endnote can also be installed on other PCs and Macs permanently connected to the campus network, and on home and laptop computers, by borrowing the relevant CD ROM from the Help Desk on the ground floor of the IT building.
